5th Pakistan Open Rock Climbing Competition – 2011

The selected route, Hang Loose category is 5A+ while the length/height of the route is about 50 feet. The competition started with the formal permission of the Chief Guest and about 100 girls

There was a very interesting and unique record made by our celebrity climber Ms. Nazia Parveen, winner of last three competitions in 2010 and 2011. For this distinctive feat, the Club appreciates her talent, hardwork and effort and cordially offers complimentary lifetime membership of the Club.
